Pastor Mary's Thoughts

"Good morning Lord, It's a beautiful day. Good morning Lord, I am going your way. Open my eyes so I am see someone who needs a friend like me. I know that I can surely be loving, caring, always sharing. Good morning Lord, I am going your way."

It is with joy that I sing this song. It is with joy that I am teaching this song to all the children who come to Sunday school. Yes, St. Mark does have Sunday school. Each Sunday I rush to take off my Alb, hang up my stole, and put my cross into a safe place so I can be with the children in Memorial Hall. I am aware that some adults who have been in worship will want to have a conversation but I think I need to rush to Memorial Hall for the Sunday school time. Please know that adults are also welcome in Sunday school. At present the number of children attending is rather small but the excitement among the children and parents make it a joy.

I have been reading a book about the ministry of teaching entitled, <u>Happiness Is a Teacher</u>. The author John Stevens Kerr begins his writing with a chapter *The teacher is a lover who is called to love... to reach out to them in a relationship that holds delighting in it because it is an expression of exuberant childhood.*

I ask, "Is St. Mark filled with members who show love?" We show love in our various ministries like collecting food for St. Vince De Paul, collecting clothing, sponsoring vaccination clinics, giving Christmas concerts, serving meals, and giving to the larger church through the New England Synod but sharing the good news of the gospel is a foundational kind of loving. Sharing the good news is loving, which is why we say bluntly that a teacher is a lover.

I talk with many St. Mark members about Sunday school because it is so vital to the health of the congregation. Right now there are two teachers beside myself. If God has called you to take part in this ministry of teaching please let me know.

As Christians, of course it is a time to prepare for the coming of Christ into the world. We celebrate this every year and for me like many folks I talk to it seems the coming of Christmas is quicker and quicker every year. That is because it seems the older, I get, the faster time moves.

I have also noticed Christmas decorations going up on homes, in stores, and the general community earlier and earlier each year. I have noticed Christmas lights on homes along my commute as early as November 13 this year. So, with time going by quicker than it ever did for me and with folks decorating for Christmas earlier in the year than ever. What should I make of all of this?

I like to think it is folks wanting to live in a world that is more Christ-like. I notice that during advent and Christmas, folks seem to be kinder. The lights on homes are like the candle's that are lit on advent wreaths. As we get deeper into the season there are more candles lit on wreaths and more lights on homes. The lights on the wreath can be considered to be the light of Christ and as we get closer to Christmas the light of Christ shines brighter. I think as we get deeper into the season folks see the joys of kindness and peace that Christ models for us. With less time each year between taking Christmas lights down and putting them up, perhaps we as a society are yearning for Christ all year long.

Let's consider the words of Jesus in the Gospel of John.

John 8:12- "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in the darkness but will have the light of life."

Christmas Wreaths


Thank you to all who bought Christmas wreaths to support the Youth Group. They were able to raise just under \$500 towards the Youth Fund.

Community Luncheon Grab and Go

The Community Luncheon Grab and Go is being held at St. Mark. People enter through the Memorial Hall door and exit through the handicap door on the side of the building. Tables are set up with food for them to take.

The Community Luncheon, provides a take-out lunch each Sunday. There is a free breakfast and lunch, Monday through Saturday given by St. Vincent de Paul, but Sunday had no opportunity for those in need to have food. Many years ago the Norwich Area Clergy Association began the practice of giving the meal on Sunday to those who live on the streets and those who have no other means of securing food. St. Mark has been involved with this important ministry from the beginning so many years ago. St. Mark has joined with other congregations here in Norwich in providing for the needy.
