

## Pastor Eric's Thoughts

#### **Catch and Release**

Catch and release is a common term among folks who like to fish as a hobby. It is fishing for the purpose of sport and the fish are released to maintain fish populations. Now that spring is here more people will be heading out to bodies of water for the enjoyment of fishing. Perhaps putting a worm on a hook and waiting to catch the big one isn't your thing, or maybe it is. I suggest we all take up fishing as Jesus has instructed.

Matthew 4:19 is part of the story of Jesus calling his first disciples. You might be familiar with the story of fishermen, Peter and Andrew who are told by Jesus to leave their nets and fish for people. Jesus used the metaphor of fishing to instruct his disciples to bring more people to God. I have decided that starting in April, we the people of St. Mark will actively fish for people. We will use the catch and release method, that is, we want folks to come to St. Mark and then head back into the community, perhaps to bring more "fish" to St. Mark. I will be putting a net up on a wall at church. We will have paper fish to put in the net. Each time you bring a new person to St. Mark, either for worship or an event you can take one of the fish, write the first name of the person on it and put it in the net. Let's see how many fish we can get in our net between now and next year.

#### **Stewardship Never Ends**

If you hear the word "stewardship" and just think of a campaign to get funds to pay the operating expenses of the church you are missing out. Giving of time or treasure should be done joyfully, recognizing it as praising God.

Stewardship for Christians should involve routine prayer about the resources and talents one has. God is the provider of all that we have, and we are entrusted by God to be good stewards. As individuals and as a church community we need to be careful and deliberate with gifts and resources. Being careful does not mean hording but instead it is sharing and spending wisely. When we view our resources as belonging to God, we can do the most ministry. Remember stewardship never ends. If you feel called to be part of a stewardship team at St. Mark speak to Pastor Eric.

# Palm Sunday - April 2

Those that are able will gather at 9:00 a.m. at Chelsea parade for blessing of the palms and then continue by walking or driving to St. Mark for Palm Sunday worship at 9:30.

# Holy Thursday - April 6 - Service of Tenebrae (Latin meaning darkness) 1:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.

Holy Thursday is also known as Maundy Thursday. Maundy means commandment. Jesus gave a commandment on that night before he was arrested and killed. **Jesus' commandment is to love one** another. We will recognize Maundy Thursday with two Tenebrae services.

This service is prayed to remind us of the consequences of sin and the magnitude of our Savior's sacrifice. The dramatic ceremony of extinguishing candles, thus casting the entire church into darkness is the movement of the worship.

# Good Friday - April 7

1:00 p.m. - Good Friday Worship: Good Friday Worship will be held in the chapel.

**6:00 p.m.** - Way of the Cross: On the first Good Friday, Jesus of Nazareth walked the way of the cross though the streets of Jerusalem to the place called Golgotha where he was crucified. Christians unite in walking the Way of the Cross, not through the streets of Jerusalem, but though the streets of Norwich. The stations will conclude by the steps of the former building of Central Baptist Church, Union Square, Norwich. We begin the walk at Chelsea Parade.

# Easter Sunday - April 9

Easter Sunday will begin with Easter breakfast in Memorial Hall at 8:30 a.m. Easter, Resurrection Sunday will be celebrated at our 9:30 a.m. worship service. Easter commemorates the resurrection of Jesus from the dead as described in the New Testament as having occurred on the third day after his burial following his crucifixion. Following worship there will be an Easter egg hunt for children.




