Pastor Mary's Thoughts

Gifts often come wrapped in paper and tied with ribbons. There is the special moment when the ribbon releases the paper and the gift is revealed but sometimes tape is holding the paper around the gift and the tape needs to be removed also. All that untying and cutting of tape is worth it when the gift is revealed. Gifts received from God the creator don't come tied and taped in paper. God gives us all that we have to use. Be reminded of all the gifts received from God the creator. Just watching the joy of others can be such a reminder. Using the gift is also necessary. I have known of those who are so excited about the gift that they save it for some time in the future and never enjoy the gift.

Use and reuse is guidance for just about everything. I do not save my good dishes just for special occasions. My mother carefully saved the dark blue wool mittens with the cable stich running down the top of the hand that her sister had knit for her. I inherited those mittens and do wear them. I take nails out of boards and put the lumber away for the next project. I took apart the tiny bridge that was across my tiny stream and saved all the pieces. Only the pieces which were rotten were thrown away. Someday those pieces will be the pattern for a new bridge. I already have the lumber needed because I saved it when I took apart a bench which could no longer be repaired. Use and reuse because everything has value. Weeds are pulled and placed on a compost pile. Next year all of them will be reused as soil. Each day God has provided me with the time to enjoy life. I intend to use the day to worship God. I will take in the air and even without my thinking about the air it will fill my lungs and give me life. I will use all that God provides and be thankful for blessings all around me.



2022 ELCA Youth Gathering

Every three years, 30,000 high school youth and their adult leaders from across the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America gather for a week of faith formation known as the ELCA Youth Gathering. Through days spent in interactive learning, worship, Bible study, service and fellowship, young people grow in faith and are challenged and inspired to live their faith in their daily lives.



St. Mark's youth will be attending the Youth Gathering in Minneapolis in 2022. These gatherings are an experience like no other. If you are eligible to attend (anyone in high school including rising freshman and seniors who have just graduated), do not pass up the opportunity! We will be fundraising from now until next July to ensure that the costs of the trip are covered. Currently, the Youth Fund has \$3,981.17 set aside for the Gathering.

The Community Luncheon Grab and Go is being held at St. Mark. People enter through the handicap door on the side of the building. Tables are set up with food for them to take, and they go out through the Memorial Hall Door to the parking lot.

The Community Luncheon supported by the Norwich Area Clergy Association provides a take-out lunch each Sunday. There is a free breakfast and lunch, Monday through Saturday given by St. Vincent de Paul but Sunday had no opportunity for those in need to have food. Many years ago the NACA began the practice of giving the meal on Sunday to those who live on the streets and those who have no other means of securing food. St. Mark has been involved with this important ministry from the beginning so many years ago. St. Mark has joined with other congregations here in Norwich in providing for the needy. Recently, Christ Episcopal Church generously gave St. Mark a variety of food prep supplies in order to help with this ministry. Many thanks for their support!
